




## Crop Insurance



Of the 24.7 million acres planted in Iowa in 2011, 21.5 million or 87% were enrolled in crop insurance. Of the insured acreage, 20.7 million were individual buy-up coverage, with 17.2 million (80% of acres; 86% of premiums) with a buy-up level of 75% or greater. Only 258,000 (1%) were in CAT and only 398,000 (2%) were in area plans like GRP or GRIP.

## **Administrative and Operating Costs**



The chart to the left highlights how the cost to the government to administer crop insurance in the state has been drastically cut since 2008, even as total liability within Iowa has increased (from \$9.3 billion in 2010 to \$14.7 billion in 2011).
