



Of the 23 million acres planted in Kansas in 2011, 17.4 million or 76% were enrolled in crop insurance. Of the insured acreage, 16.7 million were individual buy-up coverage, with 5 million (29% of acres; 37% of premiums) with a buy-up level of 75% or greater. Only 352,000 (2%) were in CAT and only 5,000 (.03%) were in area plans like GRP or GRIP.

#### **Administrative and Operating Costs**



The chart to the left highlights how the cost to the government to administer crop insurance in the state has been drastically cut since 2008, even as total liability within Kansas has increased (from \$3.5 billion in 2010 to \$5.3 billion in 2011).
