



Of the 8.6 million acres of cropland planted in Montana in 2011, 7 million or 81%% were enrolled in crop insurance, not including over 3.7 million acres of insured rangeland. Of the insured acreage, 6.2 million were individual buy-up coverage, with 900,000 (8% of acres; 17% of premiums) with a buy-up level of 75% or greater, while 732,000 (7%) were in CAT.

Administrative and Operating Costs



The chart to the left highlights how the cost to the government to administer crop insurance in the state has been drastically cut since 2008, even as total liability within Montana has increased (from \$810 million in 2010 to \$1.2 billion in 2011).
