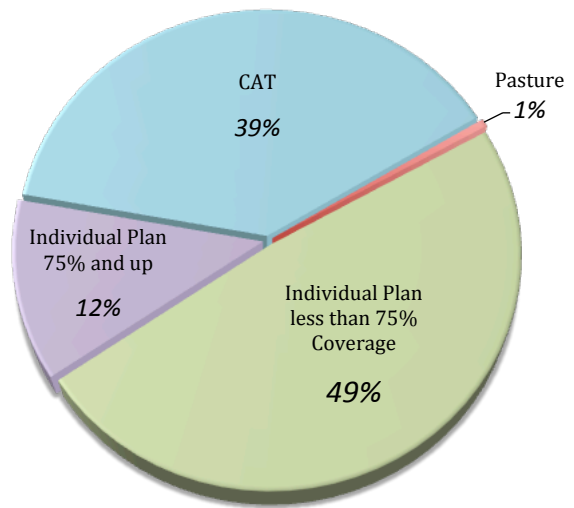


Crop Insurance

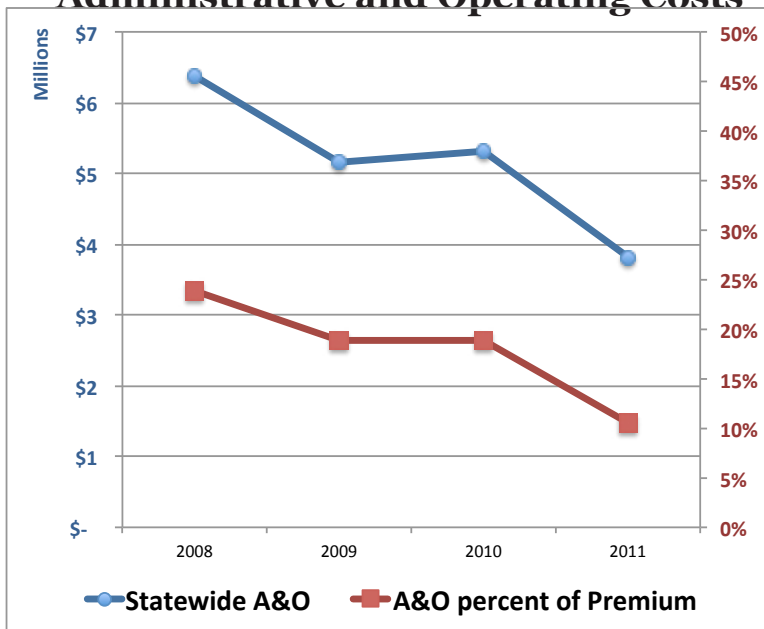

Of the 2.9 million acres planted in New York in 2011, 950,000 or 33% were enrolled in crop insurance. Of the insured acreage, 500,000 were individual buy-up coverage, with 117,000 (12% of acres; 22% of premiums) with a buy-up level of 75% or greater, while 366,000 (39%) were in CAT.

Administrative and Operating Costs



The chart to the left highlights how the cost to the government to administer crop insurance in the state has been drastically cut since 2008, even as total liability within New York has increased (from \$369 million in 2010 to \$472 million in 2011).
